

Named Chairman For 1952 Convention Of International Unit

F. J. Brennan of Saint John, president of F. J. Brennan & Co., Ltd., investment dealers, has been appointed chairman of the 1952 convention committee of Rotary International, world-wide service club organization, it was announced yesterday at Rotary headquarters in Chicago. The appointment was made by Arthur Lagueux of Quebec, newly-elected president of Rotary International.

Mr. Brennan's committee will select the site and make arrangements for the 43rd annual Rotary convention, to be held late in the spring of 1952. Working with him on the committee will be Rotarians from the United States and Mexico. A Rotarian since 1923, he is a member and past president of the Rotary Club of Saint John.

With the continued growth of the Rotary organization throughout the world, Rotary member-

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ship today is at an all-time high. More than 342,000 business and professional executives are members of 7,120 Rotary Clubs in 83 different countries.

A current Rotary activity of world-wide interest is the Rotary Foundation Fellowships program which provides grants for one year of study abroad, as ambassadors of good will, to outstanding college graduates. Since this program was established four years ago, Rotary Fellowships have been awarded to 195 young men and women from 35 countries, with grants totalling nearly a half million dollars.
