

# ROTARY PRESIDENT HERE ON TUESDAY

Quebec Man Will Attend Special Club Luncheon At Noon

Rotary Club officials said today that an exceptionally large attendance of the members is anticipated for Tuesday of next week when Arthur Lagueux, Quebec City, the president of Rotary International, will be the principal speaker at the club's regular luncheon-gathering.

The weekly event, normally held on Mondays, has been re-scheduled for the following day to give the members an opportunity to meet the distinguished visitor and to hear his remarks on a Rotary topic.

Lieutenant - Governor MacLaren and Mayor Patterson are among special guests invited to be present for the occasion, it was announced. The meeting is set for 12.30 o'clock noon, at the Admiral Beatty Hotel.

Elected to his high post, for the 1950-51 term, at the last Rotary convention, held in June in Detroit, Mr. Lagueux has been a Rotarian in Quebec City since 1931, being a past president of the club there, and has served Rotary International as director, district governor and chairman of numerous committees.

In business life, Mr. Lagueux is president of the investment corporation of Lagueux and Des Rochers, Quebec City; president of the La Sarre Power Company in La Sarre, Que., and of the Financial Building in Quebec City. He is a director of the Commonwealth International Corporation and of the Leverage Fund of Canada, Ltd., and is vice-president of the Bond Dealers Association of Quebec City, and chairman of the Re-establishment Credit Advisory Committee of the department of veterans' affairs there as well. Born at Tring Junction, Que., he was educated at St. Anne-de-la-Pocatiere College, Que., and at St. Anne's Academy, New York City. He is an officer of the Order of the British Empire.
