

Rotary International President Here Friday



TRURO, July 21—History will be made here Friday, July 28, when the President of Rotary International Arthur Lagueux (above), pays a visit to Truro. It will make the first time in the history of the service organization that an international president has visited Nova Scotia.

Mr. Lagueux will leave Amherst Thursday, July 27, for Pictou Lodge to meet with the executives of Rotary Clubs of Truro, Pictou, New Glasgow, Westville and Antigonish. Mr. Lagueux and his wife will be entertained during the day by the Pictou Rotarians.

Friday evening he will come to Truro and will be entertained at a dinner meeting at the Scotia Hotel which will be attended by members of the Pictou, New Glasgow, Westville, and Antigonish Rotary Clubs. Also present will be Edwin K. Ford, of Halifax, Rotary Governor for the Maritimes, Eastern Maine, and Newfoundland.

Mrs. Lagueux will be entertained by the Truro Rotary Anns.

Mr. and Mrs. Lagueux will leave for Kentville on Saturday.

Arthur Lagueux is President of the investment corporation of Lagueux and DesRochers in Quebec City, Canada. He was born at Tring Junction, Quebec, and was educated at St. Anne-de-la-Pocatiere College (Quebec) and at St. Anne's Academy in New York City.

Mr. Lagueux has been a member of the Rotary Club of Quebec since 1934, is a Past President of the Club, and he has served Rotary International as Director, District Governor and as committee chairman and member.

Mr. Lagueux is President of the La Sarre Power Company in La Sarre, Quebec, and of the Financial Building in Quebec City. He is a Director of the Commonwealth International Corporation and of the Leverage Fund of Canada, Ltd. In Quebec City, he is Vice-President of the Bond Dealers Association and Chairman of the Re-establishment Credit Advisory Committee of the Canadian Department of Veterans Affairs. He is an Officer of the Order of the British Empire.
