

Local Rotarians to Honor President Here Friday Night

The most important part of the year on the calendar of Santa Barbara Rotary Club members and their wives will be held Friday night in Hotel Biltmore.

On that night they will honor their international president, Arthur Lagueux and Mrs. Lagueux of Quebec, Canada. The official visit of the international president here will be his only visit to a California Club on his Western tour.

As a result, officers from a number of Rotary Clubs in the State are expected to be here for the affair, a dinner party and dance.

The Rotary head is president of an investment corporation in Quebec. His Rotary term will expire next July 1. He has been a Rotarian since 1934 and has served the International organization as director and district governor. He holds many positions of trust in his home city and is an officer of the Order of the British Empire.

After his governorship in his district, Rotary International called Lagueux to serve on several international committees, including extension, Canadian Advisory, convention and aims and objects. He served as a director in 1947-48.

He is a man who believes friendship is humanity's greatest need. In a statement he said: "A modern restatement of the ancient concept of man's brotherhood is beautiful in itself but productive of nothing unless we use it—unless we do something for somebody."
