

Rotary Head Faces Busy Schedule Here

**Arthur Lagueux Due
Tomorrow; to Inaugurate
Easter Seal Campaign**

WHEN Arthur Lagueux, president of International Rotary, arrives in Montreal tomorrow morning, he will face a busy day. It will be his first official visit as international president to the Rotary Club of Montreal. Members of Westmount, Verdun, and Montreal Westward Rotary Clubs have been invited to the luncheon. Mr. Lagueux will also inaugurate the Quebec Easter Seal Society campaign for funds for the rehabilitation of crippled children and adults.

Head table guests at the luncheon, presided over by J. J. F. Bancroft, president, will include: Maj. Gen. E. de B. Panet, chairman of the Quebec Division, Canadian Paraplegic Association; J. Arthur Lapres, president of the Quebec Easter Seal Society and of the Rehabilitation Society for Cripples, Col. W. P. O'Brien, president of the Province of Quebec Society for Crippled Children, with the presidents of the Montreal Kiwanis and Montreal Lions Clubs, whose organizations are also assisting in the sponsorship of the Easter Seal campaign in the province.

To Sign Golden Book

Mr. Lagueux, who is a director of the Easter Seal Society, with Mrs. Lagueux, will be welcomed on arrival by officers of the Rotary Club and the Easter Seal Society, and at 10.30 a.m. will visit Mayor Camillien Houde and sign the Golden Book.

Mr. Lagueux will devote the major part of his address to the great service that is being rendered to handicapped people through clubs and other organizations. He will be presented with a gold wrist watch, suitably engraved, by Mr. Bancroft, and Mrs. Lagueux will be presented with a bouquet of roses.

After his talk he will cross to the ballroom of the hotel, where about 60 paraplegics and cripples will be assembled and formally inaugurate the Easter Seal campaign by filling the first addressed envelope with a sheet of seals, a letter of appeal and a franked return envelope—one of the 250,000 to be mailed with the co-operation of Rotarians, their wives and friends.

Other Visits

Later in the afternoon Mr. Lagueux will visit the Unity Boys Club, built and maintained by Westmount Rotary Club, and then will visit the University Settlement new building on St. Urbain street, being constructed through a campaign of the Montreal Rotary Club, which raised \$375,000.

In the evening Mr. and Mrs. Lagueux will be guests at a private dinner given by Mr. and Mrs. J. J. Bancroft at the Mount Stephen Club.
