### Help For Crippled Adults

MEMPHIS, Tennessee, U.S.A. (Special)—The only orthopedic hospital in the world devoted solely to the treatment of physically-handicapped adults who are financially unable to provide for themselves is the Hospital for Crippled Adults in Memphis. Sponsored by the 247 Rotary Clubs of Arkansas, Mississippi and Tennessee, the 66-bed hospital has a staff of trained doctors and nurses, and operates a shop where braces are fitted. Some 25 doctors from every field of medicine and surgery make up the staff and give their services free. More than 5,000 physically-handicapped adults, who could be benefited by orthopedic treatment and who were unable to pay for treatment, have been treated without charge. A newly-established clinic treats each year an additional 2,000 people who do not require hospitalization.
